LIFEJACKET CLINICS

Your lifejacket may save your life one day, but only if you maintain it



properly. If your lifejacket is faulty, all you're wearing is a dead weight.

At our free lifejacket clinics, specially trained RNLI volunteers will show you how to maintain your lifejacket to keep it fully functioning. They'll show you how to check it for wear and tear and do simple maintenance tasks like replacing gas bottles and firing heads. At one of our recent clinics, we found 80% of lifejackets had faults, and many had serious defects.

Don't wait till you're in trouble to find out your lifejacket is not working properly. Find out where your nearest lifejacket clinic is by registering your interest today.

SAFETY PRESENTATIONS

Are you part of a water sports or yacht club? Looking for advice on safety procedures and equipment for club members? Our safety presentations are delivered by experienced and highly trained RNLI volunteers. They cover everything from man overboard equipment to calling for help.

VOLUNTEER REQUIRED:

VOLUNTEER COMMUNITY SAFETY ADVISOR - DARTMOUTH

This role will help us save lives at sea by promoting RNLI community safety messages to local target audiences in the RNLI's bid to reduce the number of preventable deaths and incidents that occur within the local coast and inland waterway environment

Community safety fulfils one of the four strands of the RNLI's concept of operations, saving lives at sea by providing free education and advice and facilitating other interventions through Community Lifesaving Plans.

The Community Safety Adviser is a public facing role as you will be going out into the community

and delivering the RNLI community safety advice directly to members of the community. Whilst other members of the team will be designing the Community Lifesaving Plan which is aimed at reducing fatalities and serious incidents, and targeting particular 'at risk' groups, we are asking for advisers to provide that face-to-face intervention.

This is a great role for somebody who has good communication and people skills and possibly some experience of public speaking but if not, the desire to gain some skills and/or confidence in this area. The ability to interact within a team will be important and, whilst it would be desirable to have some

knowledge of coastal activity, this is by no means a requirement to be considered for this role.

If you would like to join a friendly, dedicated and motivated team and fit the criteria above or, have some of the required skills and would like to develop further in this area, we would like to hear from you. Training will be provided to ensure a full knowledge of the RNLI and in particular the work of the Community Safety Team.
